On The Road Again* Stan Ericksen's "Checkered" Past

The other day I went to Stan Ericksen's house to help him do a little spring cleaning in his garage. We've worked in his garage before to clear out some of the cobwebs, so to speak; and it's always great fun to hear Stan reminisce about how some of the things in his garage got there or how he used them. What a great way to pass the afternoon. If I had a dollar for every one of Stan's laughs and smiles or for the ones he gave me while we were working, I'd be a very rich man indeed!

This afternoon we were clearing off Stan's trophy shelf. If you've been in the GCR for 40 years or so like Stan, I'll bet you've got a trophy shelf, too. Stan's trophy shelf is 10-feet off the ground above several work benches. We got his tallest ladder, and one of us (*not* Stan), climbed up and down that ladder about 150 times and took down every trophy, ribbon, picture, and what-not. We dusted off and boxed the trophies so I could take them to some place for donation.

As I brought down the trophies, I'd occasionally show it to Stan and ask him how he won it. Sometimes he won trophies simply for having the oldest car on a tour (1917 Overland); other times it was for something that involved skill or luck. For instance, I noticed that he had a couple of dozen or more "Driving Award" trophies. I asked Stan how they judged his driving. Did they just like his looks as he drove by and waved at them? "No," came the dignified response. "It was by my driving skill and speed!" He then described one competition in which two-person teams per car were required to drive on a course, scoop up floating ping pong balls from buckets of water along the way while not stopping (presumably it was not the driver who did the scooping), and do other feats of automotive olympics. Whoever scooped the most ping pong balls in the shortest amount of time won the event. In this case, Stan was the passenger. Instead of scooping up ping pong balls, however, Stan simply grabbed the buckets by its handle and urged his driving companion to floor it! Those in the cars behind him didn't have a chance.

Another "Driving Award" trophy was for driving on a course with a full glass of "water" on the hood of the antique car. The goal was to have the best speed and the most "water" in the glass at the end of the race. Stan's 1917 Overland had a horizontally split windshield, so he instructed his teammate, Dick Brownlee, to open the windshield, extend a stick through it, and place it on top of the glass to hold it steady. They won that event. Stan still recalls with a laugh how a lady who was watching the race saw what they had done and shouted, "Hey! You can't do that!"

While most of the trophies had bases made of marble or wood with metal or plastic doodads on them, one base was made of aluminum. It was an empty beer can with a plastic car on top held in place by a threaded rod. Stan had ZERO recollection of how he won that trophy. I wanted to ask Ellen, but he urged me not to!

Not every award involved beer and driving, but they were often competitive. At one Texas Tour, Stan felt like he hadn't won his quota of trophies. So at the awards dinner, he made his move. The Hard Luck trophy was about to be awarded to someone else, but Stan stood up and said, "I've been driving my Checker cab all over town for three days and I've not gotten a single fare." That was enough. Stan won the award! And even though Stan is "Still Fareless", he admits that with Ellen as his wife, he's been more than amply compensated over the years.

Looking at all of the trophies Stan won, he must have commanded a lot of respect at the old car tours. I say this because one of his trophies had a plaque on it that
